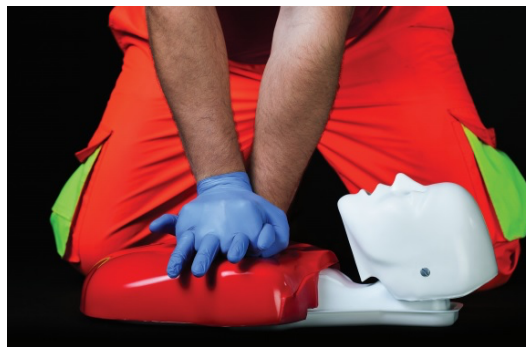


Service Description – First Aid At Work

First Aid at Work has been defined by the Health and Safety Executive as the provision of ‘the immediate care and assistance given to a person who is injured or is suddenly taken ill’.

This course equips you, the appointed person, to deal with life-threatening and urgent injuries and medical conditions.



The course is delivered over 1 day, with emphasis on skills development, and with sound theory knowledge delivered by experts who really know their subject.

Upon completion of the course, students are awarded a First Aid at Work (FAW) certificate, which is valid for three years.

This course is equivalent to PHEM (Pre-Hospital Emergency Medicine) Level B, as defined by the Faculty of Pre-Hospital Care for providers.
