

Service Description – GWO Enhanced First Aid (EFA)

This course enables individuals in the wind turbine industry to support and care for others working in the industry by possessing the knowledge, skills, and ability of enhanced first aid. The course is delivered via theoretical and practical training, in accordance with Global Wind Organisation (GWO) Enhanced First Aid (EFA) Training.

Upon completion, participants will be able to administer safe, effective, and immediate lifesaving and enhanced first aid measures to save lives and give assistance in remote areas using advanced emergency equipment and medical teleconsultation.

GWO ENHANCED FIRST AID TRAINING (INITIAL 3-DAY, REFRESHER 2-DAY)

The aim of the module is to enable the participants to support and care for others working in the industry and to provide ongoing care to an ill or injured casualty over a short period of time while waiting for professional emergency rescue teams to arrive.

Overall learning objectives for the EFA course are :-

- Participants can take responsibility for administering safe, effective, and immediate lifesaving and enhanced first aid measures in an emergency in a Wind Turbine Generator (WTG) environment (ability, intermediate level)
- Participants can act independently in giving assistance in remote areas using advanced emergency equipment and medical teleconsultation (ability, intermediate level).

COURSE DELIVERY

EFA training is delivered over 3 days, and refresher training is delivered over 2 days. Upon completion of the course, students are awarded GWO Enhanced First Aid certificate, which remains valid for two years from assessment date.

SUMMARY OF SYLLABUS

The content of the BST First Aid module is:

- Introduction
- Risks, Hazards & Legislation
- Anatomy & Physiology
- Management of an incident / Emergency response / Medical teleconsultation
- Lifesaving / EFA using Primary & Secondary survey
- Pain management & Further medication
- EFA exercises / Scenario based training
- Review & feedback session



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Delegates should be medically and physically fit to carry out the practical part of the course and be free from medical contra-indications that may prevent them from working safely (a list of conditions that could affect practical safety training is available on request).

Course participants will be required to self-certify their medical and physical fitness before commencement of the course., should be fluent in English, and aged 18 years or over.

All delegates attending a GWO Training course must supply a WINDA (www.winda.globalwindsafety.org) ID prior to undertaking training. Your WINDA ID can be obtained by creating a profile in WINDA .

CERTIFICATION

Upon completion of the course, students are awarded GWO Approved First Aid certificate, which remains valid for two years from assessment date.
