## ADOPTING CLINICAL GOVERNANCE WITH TRAUMA RESUS

Trauma Resus would appoint a medical director (a consultant grade physician practicing in an acute specialty) and clinical lead (an experienced healthcare professional working within an emergency clinical setting) for your organization, who would be responsible for providing advice and support as well as the clinical input into the governance committee.

Through the development and delivery of the quality improvement plan, the clinical governance committee would be responsible for :-

- Training & education (Trauma Resus is responsible for ensuring the clinical content of the course is evidence based, and in-line with the latest guidelines and recommendations)
- Providing support and advice on all matters relating to first aid
- Incident investigation and sharing lessons learnt
- Equipment selection and use
- · Measuring clinical effectiveness
- Risk management
- Auditing the provision of advanced first aid services and providing assurance reports to the clinical governance committee
- Attending safety days and supporting offshore exercises
- · Providing expert testimony to any external investigations
- Chairing the quarterly clinical governance committee
- This model follows the standard 5 pillar approach to clinical governance.
